## OJCF DONORS AWARD OVER \$63,000 IN NOVEMBER GRANTS

Portland, OR – The Donor-Advisors of the Oregon Jewish Community Foundation awarded a total of \$63,612 in November Grants to twenty-four organizations. OJCF is a family of well over 100 charitable funds dedicated to creating, promoting, and facilitating a culture of giving and serves as a permanent repository of funds available to safeguard the quality of Jewish communal life in Oregon and Southwest Washington.
